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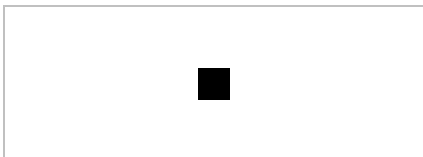
Good afternoon,

As noted in the notice, MCOs should confirm provider network status as of October 1, 2024, **based upon a network agreement between the MCO and the hospital for the managed care program (e.g., STAR, STAR Plus, STAR Kids).**

The network status should be completed **without regard to any agreements an MCO may or may not have** entered into with a hospital (or a hospital representative) related to any quality incentive payment(s).

During the initial submissions of the ATLIS Reporting Tool, we were told to document In/Out of Network for the SDA/LOB/Hospital Type combinations where we could earn ATLIS funds.
